BARBER

The objective of the Barbering course is to train students in Theory and Practical experiences, which will prepare them for the Florida State Board of Barbers Examination to become a licensed Barber and enter the field of beauty. The course is geared towards developing good work habits and attitudes with respect to safety and sanitation, business ethnics, and encourages self reliance, and a willingness to help others look their best. Academic & Practical Learning methods include discussion, questioning and answering, demonstration, cooperative learning, problem solving, interactive lecture, individualized instruction, student & classroom presentations, labs & student salon activities.

The school offers a 1200-hour training program that meets Florida state standards including 550 hours of theory and 650 hours of supervised practical training.

“Clock Hour” means a period of 60 minutes with a minimum of 50 minutes of instruction in the presence of an instructor. Courses are numbered numerically from BR101 through BR107. The course numbering system uses a five-digit alpha numeric identifier. The prefixes are characters that represent the type of course and the suffixes are numbers that represent the sequence in which they are taught.
