

FACIAL SPECIALIST 260 HOURS OF TRAINING

FACIAL SPECIALIST/SKIN CARE SPECIALIST/ESTHETICIAN

The objective of the Facial Specialist Curriculum is to train students in skin care and make-up artistry. The complete program consists of 260 hours of instructions including training in the areas of skin care and makeup techniques. The course prepares students to become a registered facial specialist in the state of Florida. Academic & Practical Learning methods include Discussion, questioning and answering, demonstration, cooperative learning, problem solving, interactive lecture, individualized instruction, student & classroom presentations, labs & student salon activities. The school offers a 260-hour training program that meets Florida state standards including 192.5 hours of theory and 67.5 hours of supervised practical training.

Clock Hour” means a period of 60 minutes with a minimum of 50 minutes of instruction in the presence of an instructor. Courses are numbered numerically from FS101 through FS107. The prefixes are characters that represent the type of course and the suffixes are numbers that represent the sequence in which they are taught.
